Once again faced with the decision of what was next I continued working at Weyerhaeuser, and was given a lead for a position at the University of Washington from my "boss" at World Vision. The position was similar to the research work I was doing at World Vision, except I would be doing the research work for the fundraising and development group for the University's School of Medicine and the two hospitals the University oversees. After a lengthy interview process I was offered the job and started on August 1st. This was a huge praise and blessing as I continued to learn and grow in understanding the non-profit development world, and got into a consistent full time position. Now 7 months later I continue to enjoy the work I do, and have integrated well into the University.

Missions:

Since arriving in Washington in 1999 and finding our home church in Duvall, WA I have been involved with the missions committee. In 2005 I served as the missions committee chairman and was elected as chairman again in 2006. Our church designates approximately 15% of general giving to missions for both short term and long term missionaries, and also for some local outreach projects. We have been looking at how the funds we receive are allocated/invested, and how they may be better utilized.

We also continue to work on ways to better communicate to the congregation what is going on in missions in the church through short missions segments monthly, and missions emphasis times in the spring, summer, and fall. Continue to pray for the awesome missions committee as we continue to hear from God on how best to guide and develop Great Commission Christians in the Duvall Church.

Be praying. There might be an opportunity for me to travel to Guatemala in late May to attend a dedication service for a church that our youth group bought the land for and helped build over the last two summers. Stay tuned for more details.
